MY APPLICATION

The following questions this week reflect on what it would mean to align yourself with the truths taught in Scripture. Each question is meant for both personal reflection and as a catalyst for discussion with your family and friends.

- Where does my financial anxiety really come from external economic circumstances or internal spiritual struggles?
- 2. Do I genuinely believe God is good and generous in His provision for me, or do I quietly assume He's either disappointed or controlling about my finances?
- 3. How have my past experiences or cultural messages influenced the way I interpret what Scripture says about money—and how can I begin to separate truth from distortion? Have I accepted a distorted or imbalanced view of what the Bible says about money—either through silence, skepticism, or exaggeration?
- 4. If Jesus trusted God as provider, what's keeping me from doing the same—and how could that trust reshape my decisions, habits, and peace around money?

MEMORY VERSE

26Look at the birds of the air: they neither sow nor reap nor gather into barns, and yet your heavenly Father feeds them. Are you not of more value than they? 27 And which of you by being anxious can add a single hour to his span of life? 28 And why are you anxious about clothing? Consider the lilies of the field, how they grow: they neither toil nor spin, ²⁹ yet I tell you, even Solomon in all his glory was not arrayed like one of these. ³⁰ But if God so clothes the grass of the field, which today is alive and tomorrow is thrown into the oven, will he not much more clothe you, O you of little faith?
