## **Discussion Questions:**

- 1. Jeremiah 29:11 may be the ultimate "Christian Coffee Mug Verse". Read and discuss the context of this favorite verse.
  - Jeremiah 29:5-7 <sup>5</sup> Build houses and live in them; plant gardens and eat their produce. <sup>6</sup> Take wives and have sons and daughters; take wives for your sons, and give your daughters in marriage, that they may bear sons and daughters; multiply there, and do not decrease. <sup>7</sup> But seek the welfare of the city where I have sent you into exile, and pray to the Lord on its behalf, for in its welfare you will find your welfare.
- 2. Even in a godless culture, God's people were called to seek SHALOM for Babylon. If Babylon would be blessed, they would be blessed. How can we seek SHALOM for our city and community?
