Teaching / Content

- <u>Short</u> lesson for each monthly meeting
- Share the teaching responsibility!
- Material should be approved by the other fathers before the meeting
- Many groups utilize a <u>theme</u> to tie the teachings together. (Worksheet 8, Sample lesson)

Example: Man and His Relationships: With God, with himself, his father, his mother, his male peers, his female peers, his siblings, the poor.



Activities (FUN!)

- Again, one of the goals is to create lifetime memories for you both.
- Examples: Camping, shooting (indoor or outdoor), hiking, hunting, fishing, sporting events (football, basketball, baseball, hockey, rodeo, roller derby), "pitch & putt" golf, caving, ropes course, "date" with mom, service project, volunteering, paintball, Segway tour, cances/kayaks on Brushy Creek Lake or Lake Georgetown, skydiving, water skiing, jet skis

Designing the Final Ceremony

Memorable Ceremonies:

- Take an <u>Investment</u> Requires an investment of thought, planning, effort and money
- Communicates <u>Value</u> Says "you are important!"
 Uses <u>Symbols</u> hammers, plaques, cups,
- compasses...
- Reinforces <u>Lessons</u> from the Journey.
- Casts a <u>Vision</u> for the future How will life be different now that this transition has occurred?



The Big Event

Administration:

- Where will you go? How long will you be there?
- Who will take care of reservations? Who will plan the meals?
- Who will organize the gear? How will you get there? Etc...



The Big Picture

- What do you want to <u>emphasize</u>, now that you have been through the entire year? What <u>changes</u> have you seen? What <u>encouragement</u> can you give?
- What <u>symbols</u> will you use to represent these important truths?
- How will you creatively communicate these truths and introduce these symbols? Foot washing, burning of boyhood behaviors, communion.
- Will you employ the element of surprise?



The Blessing

- What will you <u>say</u>? I love you; I am proud of you; I believe in you; You are mine; I am committed to you.
- Do each of the fathers speak into each of the boys lives?
- Is there a time for each Father/Son to <u>communicate</u> the Blessing separate from the group?
- Is there a <u>symbol</u> of this Blessing? Is it the same for each Young Man or individual? How will you present it?

The Conclusion

- How will you <u>recognize</u> them as "Young Men" to the entire group? (Ex. Hand shake of a man and the embrace of a father).
- How will you <u>conclude</u> the Final Ceremony? (Ex. Prayer by the Young Men thanking God for what has taken place).
- Will you have a <u>follow-up activity</u> that is designed to emphasize the "crossing over" that has just occurred?
- When will you seek <u>feedback</u> from the Young Men on what the J2M has meant to them?



Other Thoughts

- Will you include the <u>grandfathers</u> in any part of your J2M process?
- Will you include the <u>mothers</u> in any part of your J2M process?
- How will you announce this to your immediate family? Extended family? (Celebration Dinner?)
- How will you and your wife treat your son differently as a result of his successful transition into manhood? How will you communicate this to him?



Ideas for Ceremonies

- Foot Washing Father to serve son, son to serve others.
- Communion Unity as brothers in service of Christ.
- Broken Vase Desperate need for Christ to be able to walk as a man.
- Crossing Over Fire, water, other.



Ideas for Symbols Painting Faces – Warriors Gifts – Hammer, sword, crest, ring, necklace, compass (direction in life)... Plaque Others
