MY APPLICATION

Use the following questions this week to reflect on what it would mean to align yourself with the truths taught in Scripture. Each question is meant for both personal reflection and as a catalyst for discussion with your family, friends, or small group.

1. What's your favorite Christmas song and why?
2. Read Luke 1:46-50. What stands out to you from these verses and why? Why does Mary sing about that, and why should we?
3. Does it encourage you, or make you anxious that God looks on you? Why do you answer how you do?
4. Read Luke 1:51-53. Does it feel odd that God would praise us? Why or why not? Why should we get our praise from God?
5. Read Luke 1:54-55. Mary sings about God remembering his promises to Israel. Grab your phone and search "How many prophecies did Jesus Fulfill?" Read some of them as a group. How does this give you confidence that the promises yet to be fulfilled will be?
