When you consider God's kindness, how have you seen His kindness being "greater still" in your life?

What are the similarities and differences between Boaz and Jesus in 3:6-18?

How does remembering that God's kindness to you is "undeserved, yet desperately needed" change the way you live your daily life?

Have you said yes to Jesus as your Kinsman Redeemer? If so, how are you seeking to follow His direction in your life? If not, what questions, doubts or hesitations do you have?
