

The Sexual Body

The sexual body was designed by God for His purpose; however, it's been distorted by sin for selfish ends. And, as we see in Scripture, sexual holiness is God's will for our body and life, which challenges culture's view of sex.

1 Thessalonians 4:3-4 "It is God's will that you should be sanctified: that you should avoid sexual immorality; that each of you should learn to control your own body in a way that is holy and honorable.."

Sermon Points:

- 1. The sexual body was **<u>designed by God</u>** for His purpose.
 - a. God created sex. (Genesis 1:27-28a)
 - b. God confined sex. (Genesis 2:24)
 - c. God confirmed sex. (Hebrews 13:4)
- 2. The sexual body was **<u>distorted by sin</u>** for selfish ends.
 - a. Defilement of soul (Mark 7:21, 23)
 - b. Denial of God's will (1 Thessalonians 4:3-5)
 - c. Disregard for God's Spirit (1 Thessalonians 4:7-8)

Group Opener: Sex was God's idea and created to be a good thing when understood as a God thing. Like fire in a fireplace, God confined sex to the context of marriage between a man and a woman. How does this challenge our culture's view of sex? How would you answer those challenges?

Discussion Questions:

- 1. From Jesus's words in Mark 7:21, 23, how would you answer the objection, "Sex is only physical." Why did Jesus restate God's original design for sex?
- 2. Read 1 Thessalonians 4:3-8. From this text, create a short list of reasons why sexual holiness is God's will. Discuss why lust doesn't fit into God's design.
- 3. Jesus was tender toward those hurt by sexual sin. Take time to pray, ask God to give you His heart toward sexually broken people.
