III. KING SOLOMON: CHASING IDOL FANTASIES

- Ecclesiastes documents Solomon's all-out pursuit of happiness in the "broken cisterns that do not hold water."
- 3. Wisdom and Knowledge
 - Solomon chased wisdom and knowledge. "And applied my heart to see and to search out by wisdom all that is done under heaven." Ecclesiastes 1:13
 - Solomon concluded: "I have acquired great wisdom, surpassing all who were over Jerusalem before me, and my heart has had great experience and wisdom and knowledge. And I applied my heart to know wisdom and to know madness and folly. I perceived that this also is but striving after the wind." Ecclesiastes 1:16-17 [ESV]
- 4. Pleasure
 - Solomon said, "I said in my heart, 'come now, I will test you with _____; enjoy yourself.''' Ecclesiastes 2:1 [ESV]
 - All he found was vanity.
- 5. Excessive Alcohol
 - Solomon found that drunkenness was not a solution for happiness.
- 6. Accomplishments
 - Solomon tried to put his hope and identity in this ______ idol.
- 7. Wealth
 - "He who loves money will not be satisfied with money, nor he who loves wealth, with his income; this also is vanity." Ecclesiastes 5:10 [ESV]
- 8. Sex
 - Even with 1,000 women at his disposal, Solomon found it all vanity.
- 9. Work
 - Solomon found that work makes for a terrible ______ another broken cistern.

IV. PAUL: THE IDOL OF SELF-RIGHTEOUSNESS

 Paul describes his impressive, self-righteous resume (which in his day, would have placed him in the "who's - who" of the religious elite): "If anyone else thinks he has reason for confidence in the flesh, I have more: circumcised on

the eighth day, of the people of Israel, of the tribe of Benjamin, a Hebrew of Hebrews; as to the law, a Pharisee; as to zeal, a persecutor of the church; as to righteousness under the law, blameless." Philippians 3:4-6 [ESV]

- Paul concludes later that: "But whatever gain I had, I counted it as loss for the sake of Christ. Indeed, I count everything as loss because of the surpassing worth of knowing Christ Jesus my Lord. For His sake I have suffered the loss of all things and count them as rubbish, in order that I may gain Christ." Philippians 3:7-8 [ESV]
