Sermon Description

- 2. How is your life different as a believer, verses before you were saved? Do you experience joy differently and where do you find it?
- 3. In Ezekiel, many people were experiencing confusion about God's sovereignty; they believed God should be doing things differently in their lives. How does God's love & salvation for you help put the hard and confusing times into eternal perspective?
- 4. Pray as a group that someone far from God will be drawn closer to God by opening an opportunity to give, serve, or share this holiday season.
