



## “Can These Bones Live” – Ezekiel 37

### Sermon Description

In Ezekiel 37, the valley is described as full of dry bones. Do you believe that God can resurrect and restore His people — you and me? He can and does. If you consider yourself a follower of Jesus, it's important to remember what you've been saved from to experience the joy of your salvation.

### Sermon Points:

1. Can God resurrect His people?
2. Can God resurrect you and me?

**Group Opener:** What are you most grateful for this Thanksgiving? How will you express and celebrate your gratitude?

### Discussion Questions:

1. Was there anything you learned from Tim's message about the history of Thanksgiving? Was Lincoln's tie to Thanksgiving and its history news to you?
2. How is your life different as a believer, versus before you were saved? Do you experience joy differently and where do you find it?
3. In Ezekiel, many people were experiencing confusion about God's sovereignty; they believed God should be doing things differently in their lives. How does God's love & salvation for you help put the hard and confusing times into eternal perspective?
4. Pray as a group that someone far from God will be drawn closer to God by opening an opportunity to give, serve, or share this holiday season.
