Scripture: 1 Kings 11-14

Sermon Points:

Relating with God means entering and advancing His story

- 1. Do not put personal convenience over faithful obedience (cpts 11-12)
- 2. Do not put self-affirmation over God's correction (cpts 13-14)

Group Opener:

Our default perspective is, "It's all about me!". Have you ever "caught yourself" in a moment of selfishness and had to change how you were treating someone.

(Leaders you may want to prepare an answer for this and share first)

Discussion Questions:

- 1. God called Jeroboam to walk as David walked in 11:37-38. How did David walk with God? What traits were to be emulated?
- 2. In 1 Kings 12:26-30, Jeroboam created a religion of convenience. Why did he do that? How did the people fall for it?
- 3. How might we be falling for a religion of convenience today?
- 4. Because God loves us, He corrects our idolatries. How has God's Word been correcting you lately? How have you responded to that?
- God's people followed in "the sins of Jeroboam" to their downfall (14:16). Take time and humbly pray through your answers to question 4 above.
