MY APPLICATION

Use the following questions this week to reflect on what it would mean to align yourself with the truths taught in Scripture. Each question is meant for both personal reflection and as a catalyst for discussion with your family, friends, or small group.

- 1. Our Hill Country mission statement is: Each of us, together, saturating Greater Austin with the love of Jesus. What do you like about that statement? What energizes you as you read it?
- 2. Read Mark 2:13-17. What do you think it was like for Levi to have Jesus meet him where he was and invite him to follow? Are there people in your life you feel God leading you to meet where they are? Who are they? What is their story?
- 3. What do you think the party was like with Levi and his friends? Is it a normal rhythm in your life to get together around a table with people of varied backgrounds? Why or why not?
- 4. Note the image Jesus uses in Mark 2:17; that of a doctor and sick people. How does that change our view of those far from God?
- 5. Spend some time praying as a group for the people in your life that you could bring Jesus to and think of a step you could take this week to do that.
