1.	The bible describes as the second Adam.					
	• Romans 5:17-19 "For if, because of one man's trespass [Adam], death reigned through that one man, much more will those who receive the abundance of grace and the free gift of righteousness reign in life through the one man Jesus ChristFor as by the one man's disobedience [Adam] the many were made sinners, so by the one man's obedience the many will be made righteous." [ESV]

	• 1 Corinthians 15:45-47 "Thus it is written, the first man, Adam became a living being; the last Adam became of life-giving spiritthe first man was from the earth, a man of dust; the second man is from heaven." [ESV]

IV. A COMPELLING DEFINITION OF AUTHENTIC MANHOOD

1.	Reject	

- Adam was passive in the garden:
 - o "So, when the woman saw that the tree was good for food, and that it was a delight to the eyes...she took of its fruit and ate, and she also gave some to her husband who was with her, and he ate." Genesis 3:6 [ESV]
- Jesus rejected passivity:
 - o "Jesus, who, though he was in the form of God, did not count equality with God a thing to be grasped, but made himself nothing, taking the form of a servant, being born in the likeness of men. And being found in human form, he humbled himself by becoming obedient to the point of death, even death on a cross." Philippians 2:5-9 [ESV]

2.	Accept	

- Adam failed in the three specific responsibilities that were given to him by God.
 - Jesus accepted responsibility for a will to obey:
 - "My food is to do the will of him who sent me and to accomplish his work." John 4:34 [ESV]
 - Jesus accepted responsibility for a work to do:
 - "I [Jesus] glorified you [God] on earth, having accomplished the work that you gave me to do." John 17:4 [ESV]
 - o Jesus accepted responsibility for a woman to love:
 - "Husbands, love your wives, as Christ loved the church and gave himself up for her." Ephesians 5:25 [ESV]

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- Adam failed to lead in the garden.
- Jesus led by providing direction for others. He told his disciples "follow me."
 Matthew 4:19 [ESV]
- Jesus led by providing protection for others. He said "I am the good shepherd. The good shepherd lays down his life for the sheep." John 10:11 [ESV]
- Jesus led by providing life for others: "The first man Adam became a living being; the last Adam [Jesus] became a life-giving spirit." 1 Corinthians 15:45 [ESV]



4.	Eternally.					
	 Adam invested in the temporary, choosing what would satisfy him in the moment. 					
	Jesus invested in the eternal. He lived it and taught it.					
	o In Matthew 6:19-20, He said, "Do not lay up for yourselves treasures on earth, where moth and rust destroy and where thieves break in and steal, but lay up for yourselves treasures in heaven, where neither moth nor rust destroys and where thieves do not break in and steal." [ESV]
