## **MY APPLICATION**

Use the following questions this week to reflect on what it would mean to align yourself with the truths taught in Scripture. Each question is meant for both personal reflection and as a catalyst for discussion with your family, friends, or small group.

- 1. What is your personal experience with poverty? Do you have any relationships with people in poverty? Explain.
- 2. In what way is care for the poor a gospel issue? See 2 Corinthians 8:9; Proverbs 14:31; James 2:5-9; Matthew 25:31-46.
- 3. Think of obstacles that we tend to construct to harden our hearts to the poor (e.g. blame them, expect someone else to help, etc.). Discuss how to get past these.
- 4. Why is gratitude and generosity a gift from God to us? See Deuteronomy 15:10-11; Luke 12:33-34; Proverbs 22:9.
