This is the most significant thing that can ever be said about your son...

Genesis 1:26-27 "Then God said, "Let us make man in our image, in our likeness, and let them rule over the fish of the sea and the birds of the air, over the livestock, over all the earth, and over all the creatures that move along the ground." 27 So God created man in his own image, in the image of God he created him; male and female he created them."



Nothing they do and nothing they will become will ever come close to the <u>dignity</u> and <u>honor</u> and the <u>value</u> they all ready have being an <u>image bearer</u> of God.



God himself attests to this in Genesis 9:6 where God commands:

"Whoever sheds man's blood, by man his blood shall be shed, for in the image of God He made man."



James 3:9 warns us about the dangers of the tongue because: "With it we bless our Lord and Father; and with it we curse men, who have been made in the likeness of God;"

Prone to drift in destructive ways.


> A community of men who will hold them accountable
