## SESSION #12 JOURNEYMEN: Genesis and Manhood

I. The Genesis "epic"

A. The epic story of Genesis explains and measures <u>manhood</u>.

B. It explains the original *ideal* and our ongoing *fallenness*.

II. What Genesis Says About Manhood

A. Genesis 1

- 1. Male and Female value (Genesis 1:26-27)
- a. <u>Shared</u> image b. <u>Equal</u> value

2. Male and Female calling (Genesis 1:28)

B. Genesis 2-3

1. Male and Female Distinctive

a. God created Adam <u>first</u>. (Genesis 2:4-7)

b. God gives Adam an <u>occupation</u> with responsibility. (Genesis 2:15)

c. God <u>instructed</u> Adam about the responsibility of leading with <u>His word</u>. (Genesis 2:16-17)

d. God instructs Adam to <u>name</u> the animals, a sign of <u>leadership</u> over creation. (Genesis 2:19-20)

e) Adam is given a <u>helper suitable for him</u>, a phrase that defines the core social identity for both the man and the woman. (Genesis 2:18, 21-22)

f) Adam names his helper. (Genesis 2:23)

g) It is the man who is to leave and <u>initiate</u> a new household. (Genesis 2:24)

h) The temptation seeks to <u>reverse</u> God's original social and spiritual order. (Genesis 3:1-6)

i) God holds <u>Adam</u>, not <u>Eve</u>, accountable for this transgression. (Genesis 3:8-9)

j) Adam's response to sin has an <u>unacceptable passivity</u> attached to it. (Genesis 3:11-12)

k) Adam's judgment is based on the <u>reversal</u> of the created order. (Eve's curse is also based on her usurping God's created order.) (Genesis 3:17)

l) Adam's judgment falls not just on him (Genesis 2:16-17), but on all those under his leadership. (Romans 5:16-18)

m) Adam renames his wife as an additional sign of his <u>leadership</u> after the fall. (Genesis 3:20)

- How did this session add to, challenge or broaden your understanding of manhood?
- Was there one thing mentioned today that stands out and creates a question or a challenge?
- Discuss with your group at least one way in which by thinking, speaking or acting differently you could apply this message in your life over the coming week. Write it down below.
- How does the Genesis story make you feel as a man?
- What sense of increased responsibility do you feel from the truths of Genesis?
- Where have you seen the sin of Adam's passivity in your own life?
