# SESSION #13 JOURNEYMEN: A DEFINITION OF MANHOOD

# I. CORE CONTRIBUTIONS OF MEN AND WOMEN FROM HISTORY AND THE SCRIPTURES

- A. Women are the <u>nurtures</u> of life. Where that core contribution is honored, society prospers.
  - 1. 1 Timothy 2:15

2. "Women are <u>happiest</u>, not when given position and power, but when the creative contributions of the <u>maternal</u> role are upheld." –Margaret Mead

- B. Men are the bearers of <u>destiny</u>. As men <u>go</u>, so goes society.
  - 1. Genesis 2-3: The man was created by God with a unique <u>social</u> and <u>spiritual</u> <u>leadership</u> in mind.
  - 2. Defection from this leadership spells trouble not just for the man, but for everyone involved.

## II. TWO MEN/TWO MASCULINE IDENTITIES

- A. Adam and Jesus Christ
  - 1. 1 Corinthians 15:45-49
  - 2. "Adam and Christ stand over against each other, as two great figures at the entrance of two worlds, two creations, the old and the new .... And in their actions and fate lies the decision for all who belong to them, because all men are comprehended in them." -- Theologian Hermann Ridderbos
- B. They are the leaders of two distinct spiritual destinies. Romans 5:12-19

- C. They are the leaders of two distinct masculine destinies.
