

Fight Like the King

The fight of faith is about becoming more like Jesus, not about defeating enemies.

Discussion Questions:

- 1. In your opinion, what do Christians appear to be fighting against or fighting for these days? What is the win?
- 2. If someone watched your daily life, what might they think you are "fighting for"?
- 3. Read 1 Corinthians 9:19-23. What was Paul's win?

Though I am free and belong to no one, I have made myself a slave to everyone, to win as many as possible. To the Jews I became like a Jew, to win the Jews. To those under the law I became like one under the law (though I myself am not under the law), so as to win those under the law. To those not having the law I became like one not having the law (though I am not free from God's law but am under Christ's law), so as to win those not having the law. To the weak I became weak, to win the weak. I have become all things to all people so that by all possible means I might save some. I do all this for the sake of the gospel, that I may share in its blessings.

- 5. How does the following statement land with you or challenge you? The right fight is the fight to be Christlike, regardless.
