Discussion Questions

1. When you hear the words "submit" or "submission," what comes to mind?
2. Think about a time when it was difficult for you to submit to or trust someone in charge. What helped you trust them?

Read Matthew 6:9–10 and Mark 10:37–45.

3. The idea of submission can feel uncomfortable because we like being in control. What's one area of your life (time, money, relationships, priorities) where you struggle to trust God's way over your own?
4. Jesus teaches us to pray, "*your kingdom come, your will be done.*" What do you think it looks like to truly want God's will instead of your own? Where in your life is this hardest for you?
5. **Mark 10:45** says, "*For even the Son of Man did not come to be served, but to serve.*" Jesus, the ultimate King, chose humility and sacrifice. What does this teach you about the kind of king he is? How does knowing this help you trust him more?

6. Jesus is a king who serves, loves, and wants the best for you. How does that change the way you think about submitting to him?

7. What is one area you can choose to lay down this week and submit to him?

Moving Forward

Each morning this week, take a moment to pray Matthew 6:10: *"Your kingdom come, your will be done, on earth as it is in heaven."*

Before starting your day, ask:

- Where do I need to let go of control and trust Jesus today?
- What would it look like to live under his rule in my decisions, relationships, and priorities?

End your prayer by choosing one action that reflects submission to Jesus (e.g., being more patient, generous, or obedient in a specific area).
