



### 1. Who are you passing your baton to?

 **2 Timothy 4:1–2** “I give you this charge: Preach the word; be prepared in season and out of season...” Paul didn’t wait until the end of his life to think about legacy. He chose Timothy intentionally and invested in him with purpose. A meaningful legacy is never accidental; it is handed to someone with intention.

#### **Follow-up:**

Who is your “Timothy” in this season — someone watching you, learning from you, or shaped by your example? What step could you take this week to be more intentional with them?

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### 2. What are you practicing that others will inherit?

 **2 Timothy 3:10–11** “You, however, know all about my teaching, my way of life... faith, patience, love, endurance...” Timothy learned from Paul because he saw Paul live out his faith. Legacy isn’t formed by what we say once but by what we practice consistently. People repeat what they see, not just what they hear.

#### **Follow-up:**

What daily habit, attitude, or behavior are you modeling that others may imitate, good or bad? What is one practice you want to start or restart because you hope others inherit it?

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### 3. Who do you need to move closer to?

 **2 Timothy 1:13–14** “Guard the good deposit that was entrusted to you...” You cannot pass a baton from a distance. Paul and Timothy spent years close together, sharing life. Proximity multiplies influence, and legacy requires presence.

#### **Follow-up:**

Who in your life needs your presence, attention, or encouragement right now? What practical step could help you move closer so your influence becomes intentional instead of accidental?
