

1. What would it look like to love and serve *anyone*—even those outside your comfort zone or belief system?

Acts 2:45 – "They sold property and possessions to give to *anyone* who had need."

- The early church didn't limit generosity to their inner circle; they served anyone in need—breaking down cultural and social barriers.
- **Follow-up:** Who in your life might be considered an "anyone"? How could you reflect Jesus by serving them without expecting anything in return?

2. When have you been marked by someone's selfless or sacrificial service?

Acts 4:32 – "All the believers were one in heart and mind. No one claimed that any of their possessions was their own, but they shared everything they had."

- Radical generosity shaped the identity of the early church and left a lasting impact on the people around them.
- **Follow-up:** Can you recall a time someone's sacrifice made a deep impression on you? How might God want to use your generosity to mark someone else's life?

3. How can you use your gifts or influence to meet real needs around you?

Acts 6:3 – "Brothers and sisters, choose seven men from among you who are known to be full of the Spirit and wisdom. We will turn this responsibility over to them."

- The early church identified people with character and spiritual maturity to take ownership of serving others—it wasn't random; it was purposeful and empowered.
- **Follow-up:** What are you known for? How might your strengths, time, or leadership be used to serve others in a meaningful way?
