Discussion Questions

- Have you ever ended up in a place you didn't intend to be—physically, relationally, spiritually?
- In the parable of the Prodigal Son (Luke 15:11-32), Jesus describes two different sons and their relationships with their father. Do you relate more to the older brother or younger brother in the story?
- How can you tell when you're doing the right thing with the wrong motive? How do you know when you're obeying God for the sake of checking boxes but not for the sake of your relationship with him?
- What do you think Reed meant when he said, "Lost isn't about location; it's about relationship?"
- Where do you have a tendency to drift into rebellion or self-righteousness? How can this group support you in pursuing relationship with the Father over everything else?

God wants a relationship with us above anything else. If you find yourself lost in your sin, or lost in your self-righteousness, know that you are never so lost that God would not run after you. His invitation to every one of us is to come home.
