### Discussion Questions:

1. What do you think it takes for something to truly become a turning point in your life? What are the ingredients?
2. When you look back on your life, name an inflection point that changed your trajectory.
3. Can you remember an inflection point for you in our church—when you realized this was the kind of church you wanted to be part of? What made that moment decisive?
4. Read **Matthew 26:45–50** aloud. What do you think changed in that moment when Jesus said, “The hour has come”? Why do you think that decision became an inflection point for history?

*Then he returned to the disciples and said to them, “Are you still sleeping and resting? Look, the hour has come, and the Son of Man is delivered into the hands of sinners. Rise! Let us go! Here comes my betrayer!”*

*While he was still speaking, Judas, one of the Twelve, arrived. With him was a large crowd armed with swords and clubs, sent from the chief priests and the elders of the people. Now the betrayer had arranged a signal with them: “The one I kiss is the man; arrest him.” Going at once to Jesus, Judas said, “Greetings, Rabbi!” and kissed him.*

*Jesus replied, “Do what you came for, friend.”*

6. If someone evaluated your day-to-day life, where would they see you acting like a doer and not just a believer? What's one adjustment you need to make?
