Discussion Questions

- 1. Read **Galatians 2:20** out loud. What key words stand out to you?
- 2. In the interview, Crawford said Christianity is meant to transform your life. Would you say Christianity is one of several reference points in your life rather than the framework for your entire life? Explain.
- 3. Respond to Crawford's thought that the church must represent the destination at which culture needs to arrive. He also mentioned that getting there doesn't begin with criticizing everything wrong with culture. How do you think our church does at living this out? How are you doing personally at living it out?
- 4. The White House is not heaven. The president is not God. God does not stand up when our national anthem is played. How do you feel about those statements?
- 5. Crawford claims self-righteousness is causing people to not engage with the church—that there needs to be a revival of humility and brokenness. Think about your conversations and social media engagement. Do you come across as someone who is trying to regularly convince people of your particular opinions? Are there opportunities for you to grow in this area? If so, what are they?
- 6. Andy and Crawford talked about how our faith is something to be lived out corporately more so than individually. Would you say your faith is more of a personal journey, or do you see yourself as part of a journey alongside others? Explain.
- 7. Who is really the "lord" of your life? In other words, what or whom is most important? What would those closest to you say? Work? Kids? Significant other? Jesus? Money? Politics?
